<p style="text-align: center;">How do I apply?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ You can get the application at: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Samaritas: (877) 660-6388, or ○ On-line at: www.mietv.samaritas.org ▪ You must also apply for the FAFSA <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ www.fafsa.ed.gov <p>Verification of Court/State Ward Status forms for Financial Aid are available through your caseworker or by contacting the ETV office.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Am I eligible?</p> <p>You are, if you meet the following requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ on or after your 14th birthday you were: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ in foster care because of abuse/neglect, or ▪ a juvenile justice youth who was placed in a DHHS supervised foster care placement, or ▪ an unaccompanied refugee minor supervised by DHHS. ✓ IF adopted, were adopted from foster care on or after your 16th birthday ✓ AND have a high school diploma or GED ✓ AND attend, at least half-time, an accredited school that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ awards a Bachelor's degree or not less than a 2-year program that provides credit towards a degree, ▪ provides no less than 1-year of training towards gainful employment, or ▪ Is a vocational program that provides training for gainful employment and has been in existence for at least two years. <p>You must receive your first ETV prior to your 21st birthday. You are then eligible until your 26th birthday (5 year max), provided you receive at least a 2.0 GPA and do not have more than one incomplete or withdrawal per semester.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">What do I get?</p> <p>Up to <u>\$5,000 per fiscal year!</u> This can cover the following school-related expenses:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ tuition and fees ▪ room and board ▪ student loans ▪ books and school supplies ▪ transportation (not to exceed \$3,000) ▪ personal computer/supplies (not to exceed \$1,500) ▪ miscellaneous personal expenses ▪ health care expenses ▪ child care 	
<p style="text-align: center;">What is the Application Process?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Applications will be processed on first come, first served basis. Only after all of your application materials have been turned in and processed, and you have completed an entrance interview, will you be awarded. ▪ Once the ETV office has received your application, you will be contacted by an ETV caseworker to schedule a face-to-face or phone interview. Therefore, if your contact information changes, you must notify the ETV office. ▪ Any money owed to the school for tuition or other costs will be sent directly to the school. Other checks will be written out to vendors, such as a landlord, car insurance company, or a store. These checks will be mailed to you and you will be responsible for paying the appropriate people and companies. You are also responsible for obtaining receipts for all ETV money spent and sending copies of them to the ETV office. Resources Available to Youth Pursuing College

Ever wonder how you were going to pay for college, or who can afford to go to college? This fact sheet will answer those questions and direct you to the right places for more information.
College is affordable and available to YOU!

- ✓ All students must complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**. Students can access online at <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov> or by calling the Federal Student Aid Information Center at 1-800-4-FED-AID. The deadline for the application is March 1st. In order to receive loan money, the Pell grant for low-income students or other aid, the student **MUST** complete the FAFSA.
- ✓ The **Tuition Incentive Program (TIP)** helps pay for tuition and fees. Contact 1-888-4GRANTS for eligibility requirements or visit <https://www.michigan.gov/mistudentaid/0,4636,7-372--481218--,00.html>.
- ✓ **Education and Training Vouchers (ETV)** up to \$5,000 towards school-related costs and living fees. It is for youth that were in foster care after the age of 14. Contact Samaritas for eligibility requirements at (877)-660-METV or visit the website at mietv.samaritas.org.
- ✓ **Fostering Futures Scholarship** is a State of Michigan program that provides scholarships to young adults who have experienced foster care. The FFS is available on a first-come, first-served basis. The maximum award amount is determined annually by SSG. Funding amounts vary based on need and any other financial aid the student is receiving. Awards pay a maximum of \$3,000 per academic year. All future awards are subject to approved and available funding. www.fosteringfutures-mi.com.
- ✓ **Youth in Transition (YIT)** is another funding source that can provide financial support. If the youth still has unmet needs, the YIT fund source is available until the youth turns 23 years old. Please note that YIT is unable to pay for educational expenses and college specific costs. It can, however, pay for certain approved expenses while in college. For questions or to apply contact your local DHS office.
- ✓ **Casey Family Scholars Program** provides scholarships of up to \$6,000 per academic year for young people who spent at least 12 months in foster care prior to their 18th birthday; OR have been adopted or placed into legal guardianship from foster care after their 16th birthday; OR they must have been orphaned for at least one year at the time of their 18th birthday. Check the Foster Care to Success website at www.fc2success.org.
- ✓ **Fostering Success Michigan** is a statewide initiative that provides resources and inspiration for youth and alumni of foster care. Visit their website at www.fosteringsuccessmichigan.com.
- ✓ **Michigan Indian Tuition Waiver** pays tuition for students who are at least ¼ American Indian. Youth apply directly to the financial aid office. The Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan approves this award. Contact Melissa Kiesewetter at 517-241-7748.
- ✓ **The Detroit Scholarship Fund or Detroit Promise** is administered by the Detroit Regional Chamber and ensures that any student graduating from a high school in the city of Detroit will have free tuition to gain an associate degree or technical certificate at any one of participating community colleges. Applicants must be Detroit residents and must have attended a Detroit high school for at least 2 years. <http://www.detroitchamber.com/econdev/education-and-talent/detroit-promise/>
- ✓ **Macomb Community College** now has a Youth in Transition Scholarship Program for all youth interested in attending Macomb Community College for FREE. For more information, visit <https://macomb.academicworks.com/opportunities/5298>.
